## WALK LEADERS - AS THEY SAY, "EVERY LITTLE HELPS". PLEASE READ ON

It goes without saying, no walk leaders, then no walks. Without your support, it would be impossible for the club to continue.

The club rely on a core group of walk leaders who continue to volunteer, allowing events to take place every week of the year. A big thank you goes to all members who have volunteered to lead walks in 2019, including a couple of new names.

It is the role of the 'Walks Secretary'

to co-ordinate and enter all submissions to the programme, not cajole members into asking them to volunteer.

And now for the "Every Little Helps" bit.

It is recognised that it can be difficult for volunteer leaders or those prospective leaders, to find post walk pubs for dealing with our refreshments. Some premises require advance notice, deposits or pre-orders. Even having to arrange post walk venues can cause problems. After a discussion at the last Committee meeting and an acknowledgement of these facts, including the issue of putting some members off leading walks, the following was agreed. Volunteer walk leaders are not obliged to find a refreshment venue at the end of the walk. It will be up to the individual volunteer leader if they wish to do so. Also, just as a matter of courtesy, to consider any premises that may be available and if notice should be given that walkers on that date may be calling in for refreshment.

The walks plan for 2020 is now under construction. A list of vacant dates, highlighted in yellow is visible on the club website under the tab 'Walks 2020'.

## IMPORTANT INSURANCE REMINDER

The Committee wish to bring to your attention, and, in order to avoid any misunderstanding after further consultation with our insurers Protectivity by our Secretary, the following information; If you or group of members decide they cannot complete the full walk or take a shorter/longer alternative route, then having consulted with the leader and/or back marker, you are NOT covered by the Windmill Walkers insurance policy once you leave the main organised walk group. The insurance is not a personal insurance, but one that covers any third party claims against members on a scheduled, advertised event.

## FIRST AID TRAINING

A number of members have previously volunteered for First Aid Training and carried out by the British Red Cross in April 2016. It is now time for refresher training. This is currently being arranged for early next year. The Committee are asking for further volunteers to add to those already trained as we have seen the confidence this brings whilst on walks if required. The training is free and only takes half a day.
